

## The Twin City Game

### Single Class Era 1919-1970

**Boldface indicates teams that played again in the state tournament**

Year	Score	Comments
1919	St. Paul Humboldt 21 Mpls. South 12	The 1 <sup>st</sup> TC Game was in 1919 because this was the 1 <sup>st</sup> year that Minneapolis schools played basketball. St. Paul crowned its 1 <sup>st</sup> champion in 1912. The TC Game originated as a state tournament playoff game, which infuriated both Minneapolitans and St. Paulites. The 2 cities comprised half of the state's population and they got just one state tournament berth, and in 1919 it was just one of 14 state tournament berths. Humboldt lost to Chisholm at state to finish 10-2.
1920	No Game	Mpls. Central and St. Paul Mechanic Arts won their respective conferences. No TC Game was played because Mechanic Arts declined to compete for a state tournament berth under the format discussed above. The Minneapolis champion, Central, also declined to play and finished 3 <sup>rd</sup> in the national tournament. Mpls. South played at state and won one game.
1921	Mpls. Central 19 St. Paul Central 9	This time Mpls. Central went to the Minnesota state tournament and won the state championship, finishing at 13-1.
1922	St. Paul Johnson 16 Mpls. South 15	The TC champion—again, representing half of the state's population—was just one of 16 state tournament teams this year. Johnson lost to Mankato to finish 13-3.
1923	St. Paul Johnson 17 Mpls. Central 15	This time, both city champions were invited to play in the state tournament so this was, in a sense, the 1 <sup>st</sup> true TC Game—that is, not also a regional playoff.
1924	No Game	Both champions played in the state tournament. Johnson won one game, Mpls. South won 3 and took 2 <sup>nd</sup> place.
1925	No Game	Once again, Minneapolis declined to compete for a state tournament berth. St. Paul Mechanic Arts won the state title as the state tournament featured just 8 teams for the 1 <sup>st</sup> time. They tied the eventual state Catholic champion, St. Thomas, 21-21, during the regular season. The Trainers then needed 2OT to defeat Princeton in the region final 25-20. Their only loss came in the national tournament.
1926	Mpls. Edison 31 St. Paul Johnson 21	Minneapolis returned to the fold and went to the state tournament at 10-1 but lost to Gilbert 29-11.

1927	Mpls. South 29 St. Paul Johnson 16	South trounced Johnson. Still, it was a surprise when South won 3 upsets and the state title with one of the worst records of all champions of the single class era at 12-5.
1928	Mpls. Edison 36 St. Paul Johnson 20	Edison returned to the state tournament as a co-favorite but lost to Moorhead 29-16 in the final.
1929	No Game	Again, Minneapolis declined to participate in the TC Game or the state tournament. St. Paul Mechanic Arts was the St. Paul champion and finished 4 <sup>th</sup> at state at just 11-10.
1930	No Game	Minneapolis passed on the TC Game and the state tournament again. Mpls. South went to the national tournament and won one game. St. Paul Mechanic Arts won the state title, upsetting 2-time defending champion Moorhead 23-13 to finish 23-2.
1931	No Game	The MSHSL initiated a new format in which both Minneapolis and St. Paul could play in the state tournament but they had to defeat neighboring schools to do so. St. Paul Central defeated Stillwater and Northfield to go to state, while Minneapolis still declined to play.
1932	No Game	St. Paul Johnson lost to Northfield in the Region 4 final and so St. Paul did not play at state for the 1 <sup>st</sup> time since 1928.
1933	Mpls. North 18 St. Paul Central 14	Minneapolis rejoined the MSHSL and returned to the TC Game for the 1 <sup>st</sup> time since 1928. Central lost to Red Wing 24-18 in Region 4, while North lost to Red Wing 16-13 in the state final.
1934	No Game	This time Mpls. South declined to play in the TC Game. In place of the TC Game, the St. Paul City All-Stars defeated Cretin 20-19. Mechanic Arts won the city and Region 4 and finished 2 <sup>nd</sup> at state. South won its city and region and finished 5 <sup>th</sup> .
1935	Mpls. Edison 24 St. Paul Humboldt 20	Edison went into the state tournament undefeated but lost to Austin in the semis. Humboldt finished 6 <sup>th</sup> at 14-6.
1936	Mpls. Edison 30 St. Paul Central 13	Edison again went into the state tournament as the favorite but lost to Buhl 41-32 in one of the biggest upsets in tournament history. Central lost to Red Wing in the region.
1937	Mpls. Edison 35 St. Paul Johnson 17	Edison won the state title at 15-1 and was regarded as Minnesota's best team ever.
1938		

	<b>St. Paul Central 21 Mpls. North 14</b>	St. Paul got its first TC Game win since 1923. Both teams went to state. North turned the tables 34-27 in the state semi but lost to Thief River Falls in the final.
1939	St. Paul Central 18 Mpls. Marshall 16	This was a big upset. Central lost to South St. Paul in the section while Marshall went to the state final before losing to Mountain Lake 37-31.
1940	Mpls. Marshall 40 St. Paul Harding 25	Later in the week the St. Paul All-Stars beat the Mpls. All-Stars 36-35, and then beat Cretin 27-25. Marshall lost a big upset to Breckenridge in the state semis.
1941	Mpls. Marshall 36 St. Paul Johnson 17	Marshall was not so highly regarded this time, and lost to Mpls. Washburn in the district. Johnson did not make it to state either.
1942	Mpls. Marshall 37 St. Paul Washington 30	Washington finished just 14-11 but made it to state where they lost a couple of games.
1943	Mpls. Edison 39 St. Paul Washington 26	Both teams made it to state, where Edison lost to Austin 39-36. Washington had defeated Austin 17-16 during the regular season and did so again 21-18 in the semis. Washington then hammered Alexandria 55-33 to win the state title at 21-4. (The MSHSL says they were 22-2, but the St. Paul City Conference says 21-4.)
1944	Mpls. Patrick Henry 32 St. Paul Humboldt 26	Henry went on to win 3 state tournament games by an average of 46-27.
1945	Mpls. Patrick Henry 52 St. Paul Mechanic Arts 36	This time Henry won 3 state tournament games by an average of 54-36.
1946	Mpls. Washburn 28 St. Paul Monroe 17	Washburn went to state and finished 6 <sup>th</sup> .
1947	St. Paul Marshall 41 Mpls. Washburn 35	St. Paul Marshall went to state featuring Leon Combs and Curtis Russell, the first African-Americans to play in the tourney since 1918. They finished 6 <sup>th</sup> . Washburn lost to Mpls. Marshall in the district and Mpls. Marshall finished 4 <sup>th</sup> at state.
1948	No Game	Minneapolis schools were closed in March due to a teacher's strike. St. Paul Washington was the first unbeaten city champ in 16 years but lost to Anoka in the region final.
1949	St. Paul Washington 39 Mpls. Central 30 St. Paul Humboldt 39 Mpls. Vocational 36 Mpls. Washburn 44 St. Paul Monroe 35	There were three-way ties for the title in both Minneapolis and St. Paul, so they played three TC Games. Humboldt went into the post-season at just 11-5 and needed OT to defeat St. Paul Marshall 32-29 in a district semi-final. But, in the end, they won 9 straight games and the state title. They lost to the state Catholic champ St. Thomas 47-38 in the regular

		season, however. Mpls. Central also made it to state, where they lost to Humboldt in a semi-final 53-47.
1950	Mpls. Vocational 50 St. Paul Washington 38	Neither team made it to state. Vocational had defeated Washington 46-37 during the regular season. Vocational's star was big Bob Peterson, who later became the father of St. Louis Park, U of M and NBA star Jim Peterson. Catholic champion St. Thomas beat Washington 42-29.
1951	St. Paul Washington 52 Mpls. Edison 50	2 <sup>nd</sup> place St. Paul Monroe made it to state where they lost 2 games. Edison lost in Region 5. Catholic champion St. Thomas again beat Washington 54-43.
1952	Mpls. North 44 St. Paul Washington 39	Neither team advanced to state.
1953	Mpls. Roosevelt 59 St. Paul Marshall 53	Neither team advanced to state.
1954	Mpls. North 48 St. Paul Central 43	Neither team advanced to state.
1955	Mpls. Washburn 60 St. Paul Mechanic Arts 42	Washburn won 3 games and the state championship by an average score of 68-52.
1956	Mpls. Roosevelt 74 St. Paul Wilson 54	Roosevelt won 3 games and the state championship by an average score of 83-57.
1957	Mpls. Roosevelt 55 St. Paul Murray 32	Roosevelt repeated as state champ by an average margin of 72-60. Red Wing beat Murray 57-39 in the region, then lost to Roosevelt 59-51 in the state final.
1958	Mpls. Central 59 St. Paul Wilson 51	Both teams lost in their district.
1959	Mpls. South 50 St. Paul Central 46	Both teams lost by a total of just 10 points in their region finals. South lost to eventual state champion Wayzata 51-47. Central had clobbered South 58-40 in the regular season.
1960	Mpls. Patrick Henry 55 St. Paul Mechanic Arts 46	Neither team advanced to state.
1961	Mpls. Roosevelt 57 St. Paul Central 43	Roosevelt won Region 5 but was disqualified from the state tournament for using 2 ineligible players in the region final. Roosevelt had defeated Central 51-39 in the regular season.
1962	Mpls. South 70 St. Paul Wilson 36	South lost to eventual state champion St. Louis Park 62-49 in the region final.
1963	Mpls. North 54 St. Paul Central 39	Central got to the region final before losing to Anoka. North lost to Mpls. Central in District 15.

1964	Mpls. West 73 St. Paul Mechanic Arts 50	Mechanic Arts and Mpls. Central each got to their region final before losing.
1965	St. Paul Central 53 Mpls. Edison 44	Central breaks the string of 13 straight wins for the Mill City. Minneapolis had already led 16-8. Now they lead 29-9. Central got to state and finished 5 <sup>th</sup> .
1966	Mpls. Central 70 St. Paul Central 56	Neither team got to the region final.
1967	St. Paul Central 64 Mpls. Central 62	St. Paul Central got to state and finished 6 <sup>th</sup> at 23-3. Mpls. Central lost to eventual state champion Edina 81-57 in the region final.
1968	Mpls. Patrick Henry 48 St. Paul Highland Park 47	Highland Park got to state and lost to Moorhead 108-89 in the highest scoring tournament game ever.
1969	St. Paul Central 69 Mpls. Central 62	Mpls. South upset Mpls. Central in the district and went to state, where they lost 2 games. St. Paul Central got to the region final. St. Paul Central had defeated Mpls. Central 60-56 in the regular season.
1970	Mpls. Central 54 St. Paul Murray 45	Neither team got to a region final. Minneapolis closed out the single class era with a 32-11 lead in the TC Game. Mpls. Edison led the way with 6 wins, but none since 1943.

Year	Score	Comments
1971	No Game	The calendar did not cooperate. St. Paul schools started post-season play the following day and declined to participate. Mpls. Central finished 3 <sup>rd</sup> at state.
1972	St. Paul Murray 55 Mpls. North 52	Murray advanced to the state tournament where they lost to the eventual Class A state champs St. James 57-51. North was favored in Class AA but lost to Austin 69-52 in the 1 <sup>st</sup> round.
1973	St. Paul Highland Park 82 Mpls. Washburn 50	The worst loss ever by a Minneapolis champion in this game. Neither team made it to state. Highland Park finished 20-2 with a 9-point loss to the eventual state champion Anoka in the region.
1974	St. Paul Mechanic Arts 69 Mpls. Washburn 58	St. Paul's 1 <sup>st</sup> 3-peat. Washburn is the first Minneapolis team to lose consecutive TC Games, but went to state and finished 3 <sup>rd</sup> .
1975	Mpls. North 74 St. Paul Highland Park 51	Not one but 2 St. Paul teams (and none from Minneapolis) went to state. Highland Park lost 2 games in Class AA, while runner-up Mechanic Arts won 2 in Class A—50-49 in OT and 34-33—before

		losing to Chisholm in the final 41-33. It was a rematch of the 1934 final won by Chisholm 29-27.
1976	Mpls. Central 59 St. Paul Highland Park 44	Neither team made it to state, though Mpls. Marshall-U and North both did. Marshall-U won 3 games and the Class A title, North lost 2 games.
1977	<b>Mpls. Central 68 St. Paul Highland Park 57</b>	Central tied Edison with 6 wins in the TC Game. Highland ties Johnson (1926-27-28) with 3 straight losses. Both Central and Highland made it to state, where Central again defeated the Scots 73-59 in a consolation semi-final. Marshall-U settled for 5 <sup>th</sup> place in Class A.
1978	Mpls. Washburn 58 St. Paul Humboldt 37	Washburn finishes 3 <sup>rd</sup> at state.
1979	St. Paul Central 65 Mpls. North 55	St. Paul Central and Mpls. Central both go to state. St. Paul Central finishes 2 <sup>nd</sup> to Duluth Central 62-54. Mpls. Central takes 5 <sup>th</sup> .
1980	Mpls. North 65 St. Paul Central 59	North joins Mpls. Central and Edison with 6 TC Game wins. Both teams go to state where North wins its 1 <sup>st</sup> title. St. Paul Central finishes 6 <sup>th</sup> . Central beat North 71-59 in the regular season.
1981	Mpls. North 68 St. Paul Central 54	Both went to state. Central finished 3 <sup>rd</sup> and North 5 <sup>th</sup> . This is the 1 <sup>st</sup> time 2 teams had played 3 straight years. North also takes the lead with 7 TC Game wins, a lead that it will never relinquish. North beat Central 75-62 in the regular season.
1982	Mpls. North 66 St. Paul Central 60	North defeated Central 67-64 in a consolation semi-final. North joins Edison (1935-1937) and Mpls. Marshall (1940-1942) with a 3-peat, and North and Central play for a record 4 <sup>th</sup> straight year.
1983	Mpls. Southwest 56 St. Paul Johnson 37	Neither team went to state, but North did and finished 6 <sup>th</sup> .
1984	Mpls. North 74 St. Paul Central 60	Both teams go to state where North finishes 2 <sup>nd</sup> and Central 3 <sup>rd</sup> . North defeated Central 65-53 in the regular season.
1985	Mpls. North 61 St. Paul Central 60 (OT)	The 1 <sup>st</sup> TC Game to go OT. Central lost to St. Thomas, then a member of the St. Paul Conference and just 3 <sup>rd</sup> place, 70-66 in the region. North then hammered St. Thomas 83-54 at state, and finished 2 <sup>nd</sup> to White Bear Lake for the 2 <sup>nd</sup> straight year. Central and North had earlier played to a 38-38 tie that was called at the end of regulation due to a wet floor.
1986	<b>Mpls. North 57 St. Paul Central 55</b>	Both teams went to state where Central defeated North 49-48 for 3 <sup>rd</sup> place. Once again, Central and

		North also played in the regular season, Central winning 57-56.
1987	Mpls. North 57 St. Paul Central 53	Neither team, nor anybody from Minneapolis or St. Paul, went to state. North beat Central 68-56 in the regular season.
1988	St. Paul Central 60 Mpls. North 51	Neither team, nor anybody from Minneapolis or St. Paul, went to state. North defeated Central 60-53 and 73-64 in the regular season.
1989	St. Paul Central 87 Mpls. South 80 (OT)	The 2 <sup>nd</sup> OT TC Game. Both teams went to state where Central finished 4 <sup>th</sup> and South 5 <sup>th</sup> . South had defeated Central 79-67 during the regular season. This closed a period in which St. Paul Central won 10 of 11 city championships, and played in 10 TC Games, winning 3. Their conference record was 149-7, their overall record 211-37. Central played in 7 state tournaments, earning hardware 4 times.
1990	Mpls. Roosevelt 61 Cretin 60 (OT)	This was the start of a period in which Cretin won or tied 11 of 14 St. Paul City titles before being kicked out of the conference. Cretin got to state, while Mpls. North knocked off Roosevelt in the section, then defeated Cretin 60-54 at state. North finished 2 <sup>nd</sup> .
1991	<b>Cretin 61 Mpls. Roosevelt 45</b>	Both teams got to state, where Cretin again defeated Roosevelt 74-62 in OT in the Class AA final.
1992	Mpls. Roosevelt 60 St. Paul Central 58	Cretin had tied with Central for the St. Paul title, and Cretin and Mpls. South made it to state. South lost 2 games, while Cretin finished 2 <sup>nd</sup> to Anoka.
1993	Mpls. Roosevelt 75 Cretin 59	Cretin returned to state and Roosevelt did not, despite its impressive TC Game performance. Cretin won 3 games to win its 2 <sup>nd</sup> state title in 3 years. This concluded Roosevelt's 4-year run as Minneapolis champion with 3 TC Game wins but just one state tournament to show for it.
1994	Mpls. Washburn 77 Cretin 71	Washburn had defeated Cretin 100-95 in 3OT in the regular season. Washburn won 3 games and the state title, while Cretin won just 1 of 3 at state and finished 6 <sup>th</sup> .
1995	<b>Mpls. North 78 Cretin 62</b>	North beat Cretin again in a state quarter-final 51-48 en route to an undefeated state title.
1996	Mpls. North 65 Cretin 47	North returned to the state tournament and repeated as champion with one loss.
1997	Mpls. North 92 St. Paul Highland Park 71	

		North was the 2 <sup>nd</sup> team ever to 3-peat as state champion, while Mpls. Roosevelt also made it to state in Class AAA and finished 3 <sup>rd</sup> .
1998	Mpls. North 61 St. Paul Central 52	North had defeated Central 60-43 during the regular season. They finished 4 <sup>th</sup> in Class AAAA. This marked North's 2 <sup>nd</sup> 4-peat in the TC Game (1984-1987 and 1995-1998).
1999	St. Paul Highland Park 76 Mpls. Patrick Henry 75	Both teams advanced to the Class AAA state tournament where Highland Park became the 1 <sup>st</sup> St. Paul public school in 50 years to win a title. Henry lost in OT in the 1 <sup>st</sup> round. Mpls. North finished 4 <sup>th</sup> in Class AAAA.
2000	Mpls. Patrick Henry 68 Cretin 53	Henry advanced to state and won the AAA title. 3 <sup>rd</sup> place St. Paul Central defeated Cretin in the section and lost its only game in the AAAA tournament.
2001	Mpls. Patrick Henry 68 Cretin 67	Henry repeated as AAA champion, while Cretin finished 3 <sup>rd</sup> in AAAA.
2002	Cretin 81 Mpls. Patrick Henry 75	Henry 3-peated in Class AAA. 2 <sup>nd</sup> place Mpls. North defeated Cretin 55-54 in the AAAA region and took 3 <sup>rd</sup> at state.
2003	Mpls. Patrick Henry 75 St. Paul Harding 67	Henry completed its 4-peat in AAA while 2 <sup>nd</sup> place North won the AAAA title. 4 <sup>th</sup> place St. Paul Como Park made it to state and took 3 <sup>rd</sup> place in AAA. Cretin tied for 1 <sup>st</sup> in St. Paul for its 11 <sup>th</sup> title in 14 years with a record of 129-10 in those 11 years. In those 11 years, there were 7 state tournaments, 2 state titles, but just 2 wins and 7 losses in the TC Game. This year also marked the end of Mpls. Henry's run of 5 Minneapolis titles, 5 state tournaments, 4 state titles and 3 TC Game titles.
2004	Mpls. North 61 St. Paul Johnson 59	Johnson got to state and finished 4 <sup>th</sup> . North did not .
2005	Mpls. North 77 St. Paul Central 72	Nobody from Minneapolis or St. Paul advanced to state.
2006	Mpls. North 72 St. Paul Johnson 59	North defeated Johnson 75-72 in the regular season. Johnson got to state and finished 4 <sup>th</sup> .
2007	St. Paul Johnson 79 Mpls. Patrick Henry 77	Henry had clobbered Johnson 81-61 in the regular season. Johnson got to state but lost its only game.
2008	St. Paul Central 93 Mpls. Patrick Henry 81	Henry got to state in AAA as did St. Paul Como. Henry finished 4 <sup>th</sup> while Como lost its only game.
2009	<b>Mpls. Washburn 67 St. Paul Johnson 64</b>	Johnson had defeated Washburn in 2OT in the regular season. Washburn then defeated Johnson



		91-66 in a Class AAA state semi-final en route to the state title. Johnson finished 3 <sup>rd</sup> .
2010	St. Paul Johnson 92 Mpls. North 67	Johnson went on to win the Class AAA title at 32-0. They had defeated Class AAAAA champion Hopkins 86-78 in a holiday tournament game.
2011	Mpls. Washburn 85 St. Paul Johnson 80	Johnson lost a huge upset to New Prague in their only state tournament game.
2012	<b>Mpls. Washburn 90 St. Paul Johnson 89</b>	Washburn defeated Johnson 75-66 in a state AAA semi-final, then lost to DeLaSalle 57-56 in the final. Johnson finished 3 <sup>rd</sup> .
2013	St. Paul Johnson 99 Mpls. Southwest 72	Johnson finished 4 <sup>th</sup> in Class AAA.
2014	St. Paul Johnson 91 Mpls. North 81	Johnson defeated St. Paul Central 75-67 and 78-60 during the regular season but lost to Central 60-56 in the section. Central then lost big to DeLaSalle at state.
2015	St. Paul Johnson 123 Mpls. North 119 (2OT)	One of the great games of the 21 <sup>st</sup> century. Johnson made it to the AAA final where they lost to DeLaSalle 82-64.
2016	Mpls. North 83 St. Paul Central 70	North had beaten Central 83-71 in the regular season. North made it to state in Class A after coming close to closing and suffering a precipitous decline in enrollment. North still fielded an elite basketball team, however, and it steamrolled the Class A competition by an average of 80-44, for an all-time tournament record 36 point average margin.
2017	Mpls. North 81 St. Paul Central 65	North repeated in Class A by the record margin of 96-50.
2018	Mpls. North 84 St. Paul Johnson 58	North moved up to Class AA but lost in the section, so far the 1 <sup>st</sup> time since 2005 and for just the 2 <sup>nd</sup> time this century, nobody from the Minneapolis or St. Paul City conferences made it to state. This may have marked the end of the Johnson dynasty under coach Vern Simmons, who retired. The Govs won or tied for 14 of 15 city titles with a record of 153-8. They made 8 of 15 state tournaments with a title in 2010.
2019	St. Paul Central 77 Mpls. North 74	North finished 2 <sup>nd</sup> to Minnehaha in Class AA. Central lost to East Ridge 64-52 in the Section 3AAAA final.
2020	Mpls. North 86 St. Paul Johnson 79	For North, it was their seventh straight game, for Johnson their twelfth in 17 years. North was among

		<p>the favorites for the state title in Class AA when the tournament was cancelled due to the coronavirus. Johnson was upset in its first section game, which proved to be coach Vern Simmons' final game, while St. Paul Humboldt and Washington at least won one game before being eliminated.</p> <p>North has won 27 Minneapolis City titles in the 50 years of multi-class ball with 20 state tournaments and 7 state titles to become the dominant inner city power of the era. In TC Games, they are 19-8 in the multiclass era and just 4-1 in the single class era for a total record of 23-8, making them the overall leader in wins and appearances.</p> <p>Meanwhile, St. Paul Central (which remains in Class AAAA) and Johnson (Class AAA) and Cretin (no longer a member of the city conference) have won or tied 37 of the last 39 St. Paul City titles, as St. Paul's liberal transfer rules have facilitated the formation of super-teams (Central or Johnson) within the city. But, a great many of St. Paul's best athletes are also transferring out of the city, principally in recent years to Minnehaha.</p>
2021	No Game	For the first time in 50 years, there was no TC Game due to COVID. Mpls. North won the Minneapolis title at 9-0, 15-2 while St. Paul Central and Highland Park tied in St. Paul at 10-2 (Central was 11-3, Highland 10-3 overall). It was Highland's first title of the 21 <sup>st</sup> century (since 1999).
2022	Mpls. North 59 St. Paul Johnson 56	Both North and Johnson were undefeated in their respective city conferences. North went on to finish 2 <sup>nd</sup> in Class AA, while Johnson was beaten by Mpls. Henry (9-15, 6 <sup>th</sup> place in Minneapolis) 74-70 in the 1 <sup>st</sup> round of AAA play.
2023	Mpls. North 86 St. Paul Johnson 72	<p>Johnson won its 17<sup>th</sup> city title and played in its 14<sup>th</sup> TC Game since 2004. Its record dropped to 5-9 since 2004 and 7-17 overall. North improved its record to 20-5 in the TC Game since 1980.</p> <p>In the multi-class era, Minneapolis enjoys a 37-15 edge in the TC Game for a total as of 2023 of 69-28.</p>
